Dr Eliana Gil: “An Integrated Approach to Helping Traumatized Children”

Eliana has written extensively on the impact of trauma on children and preferred models of intervention. Her presentation will explore children’s individual responses to traumatic experience, as well as the wide range of defensive mechanisms put into place as a response to traumatic stressors. This presentation will provide information on the consensus areas for treatment, including reviewing the development of evidence based programmes, and then provide several methods for advancing treatment goals. Specifically, both expressive and behavioral therapies, directive and nondirective, and verbal and nonverbal approaches will be discussed.

Dr Gil is a registered Play therapy Supervisor, Registered Art Therapist, with a Doctorate in Family Therapy. She has served on the Board of the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children and is a former President of the Association for Play Therapy in the U.S. Her publications include: Helping Abused and Traumatized children: Integrating Directive and Non Directive Approaches; Cultural Issues in Play Therapy (With Dr Athena Drewes); Systemic Treatment of Families who Abuse; The Healing Power of Play; Play in Family Therapy; and Sexualised Children: Assessment and Treatment of Sexualised Children. (with Dr Toni Cavanagh Johnson)

Friday 25th June 2010 1.30 – 5.00pm : Pre Conference Workshops.

Choose from two Specialist workshops for Experienced Practitioners:

1. **Dr Eliana Gil: “Using Expressive Therapies in the Assessment of Trauma with Children and families”**
This experiential workshop will explore a range of creative therapy tools used for the purpose of assessment with children and the identification of traumatic experience. Participants will be able to consider and practice a number of different techniques to improve their assessments, incorporating both non directive and directive models of intervention. These will include the family play genogram, the family scribble drawing, and the circles project.
2. **Dr Athena Drewes: “Effectively Blending Play-based Techniques with Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for Affect Regulation in Sexually Abused and Traumatized Children”**
This hands-on experiential workshop will offer a variety of play-based techniques that can be used with children who have been sexually abused. Participants will be helped to utilize a treatment approach that can include directive, non-directive and integrative modalities in assessing best practices. The various healing powers of play will be addressed, especially for traumatized children with limitations to verbalizing emotional issues during treatment.

Saturday 26th June 2010

Morning Workshops – please indicate first and second choice:

Dr Athena Drewes: “Helping Fostered Children Heal From Trauma and Broken Attachments”
This workshop will look at several evidence-based treatment approaches and considerations in working with the caregiver, as well as dealing with allegiance issues, and a brief look at play therapy themes, seen in a case example.

Steve Harvey: “Dynamic Family Play Therapy”
Dynamic Play is an intervention style in which family members participate in expressive play activities together, including collaborative art, movement, drama, storytelling, designed to address both presenting problems as well as core conflicts among family members. This approach is particularly useful in helping families address family attachment and the psychological trauma of younger children.

Eileen Prendeville: “The Play Therapy Process: Interventions Following Discovery of Child Sexual Abuse”
This workshop will explore the impact of Child Sexual abuse on the development of identity (using an Embodiment-Projection-Role framework) and world view (including world view, trust and relationships). We will then look in detail at the healing process itself within the playroom and consider why play therapy is an effective intervention.

Dr Virginia Ryan & Dr Sue Bratton: “ Traumatic re-enactment in Play and Filial Therapy”
One of the most delicate, yet emotionally demanding, situations for play therapists is helping children and young people re-work traumatic experiences in play therapy. The workshop offer ways of working which seem safe and productive in non-directive play therapy, and then consider the similarities and differences with filial therapy approaches and the role of parents/ carers.

Tim Woodhouse: “Assessing the evaluation or evaluating the assessment? Tools that help the therapist decide when to say no to providing play therapy “
This workshop will focus primarily on children and families affected by sexual harm. Participants will be provided with an opportunity to consider the impact of trauma and the contra-indications for play therapy under these circumstances. A number of measures that can inform our assessments, decision-making and evaluations will be explored.

Joy Hasler: “Broken chords: music in play therapy with traumatised children and their families”
Joy Hasler is a Music Therapist who has developed a trauma recovery model of therapy with an attachment focus for looked after and adopted children/young people and their families. The aim of this workshop is to give participants the opportunity to increase confidence in using music as part of play therapy, and to explore working with trauma and attachment issues with parents and children together. No musical skills are required.

Afternoon Workshops – Please indicate first and second choice:

Eliana Gil: “Responding to Young Children with Sexual Behavior Problems”
More and more young children are identified with problem sexual behaviors that include sexual preoccupation, excessive masturbation, inappropriate touching of peers, and sexual acting out. These behaviors do not occur in a vacuum and it is necessary to uncover what precipitating interpersonal and environmental factors may be contributing to these problems. A family-based treatment model will be presented which incorporates expressive and behavioral techniques.

Alison Webster: “Attuning to the Child’s World: Strengthening Therapeutic Alliances through Narrative Play”
This workshop will explore why developing play therapy narratives between ourselves, systems and the child are important in helping to strengthen therapeutic alliances; We will consider how our perceptions of these relationships can enhance or hinder therapeutic processes and how “narrative collaboration” can enhance safeguarding and early intervention.

Ann Marie John: “Playing Family Therapy or doing Family Play Therapy ?”
This workshop will explore the boundaries between systemic Family Therapy and Play Therapy. The workshop will include theoretical and experiential elements with reference to the use of the reflecting team as a playful ritual, circular questioning and creative geno-grams. Particular attention will be paid to social difference, power and how the network reflect on the family.

Lisa Waycott & Lisa Finlayson Clements: “Integrating Play and Art Therapy approaches to Working with Children and young people with Attachment Difficulties”
The workshop will aim to introduce a theoretical model to participants which draws, on attachment and systemic theory, before considering assessment approaches, including using Theraplay® techniques and how research and theory influences clinical practice. The experiential element of the session will explore how play and art therapies can be used together to assess and provide interventions for children and families.

Mike Falcus: “Sawing and Sanding with Kids - The Cutting Edge of Child Therapy”
This experiential workshop will consider the value of sandplay with traumatized children in play therapy, with exploration of a child’s use of this therapeutic medium, the principles of practice for the therapist and presentation of a Case study example. The workshop will include an experiential piece using sand trays (This workshop is limited in numbers to 12 and will be allocated on first come first served basis)

Debra May: “A System to Analyse Play Therapy Themes in relation to a Child’s Resilience”
Observing and analyzing themes that emerge in play therapy is a key role in any therapeutic intervention. The themes can be new or recurring and they can take subtle shifts in direction and emphasis at any time during the play therapy process. This workshop will explore the use of a tool to help play therapists identify and evidence progression across an intervention, with particular reference to resilience factors (self esteem, self efficacy and problem solving skills.)
